

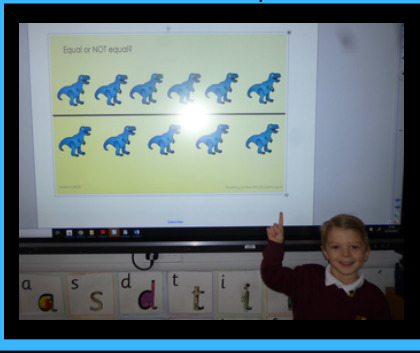

Gurlveen for overcoming her fears during our Reptile workshop, by touching and holding the animals.



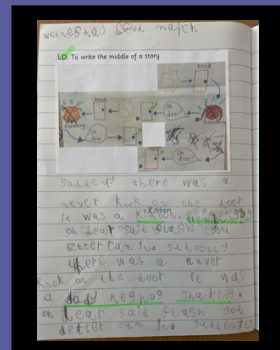

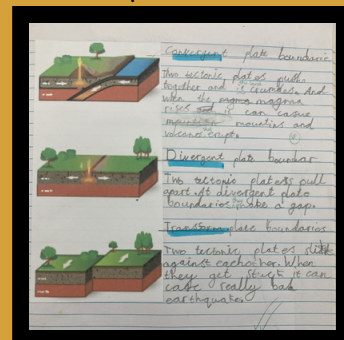
