Weekly News

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we arrive at the end of the first half of the summer term, these are the week's highlights:



- The week began with classes 3B and 3C visiting the Tate Gallery.
 I had some super feedback from the Gallery about the behaviour
 - of our children. It's always a delight when I receive those calls and it makes me realise just how much better we are than other schools. The two classes thoroughly enjoyed themselves but were somewhat bewildered by a plain white metre square being sold as a piece of much sought-after artwork!!! I couldn't really answer them because that bewilders *me* as well!!
- It was all about the sex this week as we had our annual sex education talks for parents. This year, we trimmed down the talk so it didn't include the 'Relationships' part of Relationships and Sex Education. This is because we are now obliged by law to inform parents about the Relationships curriculum which we have done by parent mail and our website so we didn't see the need to include it in the Sex Education Talks. To be honest, it made it much clearer to parents exactly what is being taught in sex education and those who joined us fed back that it was extremely clear and concise and put their minds at rest about our approach to the topic. It also meant that the talk lasted for half the usual length of time a win for everyone!! A big thank you to Miss B who always prepares and delivers these presentations so thoroughly.
- Sticking with sex, you'll be aware that there's been a lot of talk in the news recently about redrafting the sex education curriculum. Sex Education is always a controversial topic but the new draft policy is now out for consultation and you can have your say about it by taking the DfE survey. - The most pressing issue that came up at the meeting was that of children having access to the internet on their phones including Tik Tok, WhatsApp, YouTube etc and the problems this causes. We talked about St Albans' bid to become the first smartphone-free city for children under 14 because of the negative impact smartphones have on children's mental health and development and how we should do something similar here but for under 11s. I'm aware of some 6 year old children being on WhatsApp chats with 10 year olds and 14 year olds and seeing and hearing totally inappropriate and damaging content because of the diverse ages of the group. It does seem to have gotten out of control and we are damaging our children but we ALL have to agree to keep our children off the smartphones if anything like this was ever going to work because peer pressure is too strong to resist!
- Still staying with sex....we offered 3 talks this year to tell parents about the content of sex education in each year group and, although only 6 parents booked the evening slot, we thought it was worth running it but, unfortunately, no one turned up. I felt very sorry for Miss B who had stayed late to give her presentation and it reminded me of the same thing that happened with the 2 Johns. I do understand that it's really difficult to come out at night once you're home from a long day at work but it does have such an impact on teachers who are also tired and desperate to get home to eat and carry on marking and prepping for the next day. So, I have decided that we will only run day-time meetings in future as they seem to suit you far better (and us!). Parents' evenings will still be in the evenings but, unless there is any good reason to do so, we won't offer any more evening meetings.
- We had National Numeracy Day on Wednesday. Year 5 joined the National Numeracy Day live interactive, space-themed, celebrity-led livestream while Year 2 played maths bingo, learnt a cowboy dance by counting steps with Katya from 'Strictly' and made up our own maths rap with actions. 4A did a number dance, some maths puzzles and some extra TTRS in the ICT suite. Other activities included Bot Bingo, Bonds Bingo and lucky number cake baking!







- As you are aware, we smashed the race to the most votes for the Dunelm support and very proud we were, too! This week, I waited for the call to let me know what our Dunelm donation prize would be! Well, you can imagine my disappointment when they told me that they wouldn't be donating anything but they'll put a trolley outside their shop with our school's name on and a wish-list that we should put together for their customers to donate products to us!!!!!
