### **Weekly News**

Dear Parents and Carers,

Another busy week. Here are the highlights:

• Well, I have to begin *this* week's newsletter by returning to *last* week's news first. I was severely reprimanded last weekend because I had forgotten to include a very important visit in



the newsletter - Year 1's visit to the Hertfordshire Zoo! It was amazing according to the children, volunteer supporters and teachers!   positive feedback and for your questions as well since that shows us that certain areas
  need to be clearer or it gives us an opportunity to explain our decisions to you. I love
