Dear Parents and Carers,

- Back to this week and we began the week with a mental health afternoon in which we
 prepared the children for transitioning to their next class. It's a big step for many children
 who find the move to a new teacher and a new classroom quite daunting so an afternoon
 to talk about it and gain reassurance is helpful for so many (even those that appear to be
 so confident because they are often masking a hidden anxiety that even they may not be
 aware of!).
- Hannah (6B) and Gemma (6A) ran their last badge sale this week. They were selling the
 winning badge design 'Kindness spreads here at HLPS' as well as a variety of other designs
 including House Team badges which were fantastic designs. They made a grand total of
 £434.24 which will be split equally between 'The Cats Protection' and 'The Salvation Army.

- Well done to both girls for such an outstanding enterprise.
- Y5, this week, were invited to Hornchurch High School for a taster secondary school lesson in Trampolining and a tour around the school. The children had a wonderful time experiencing a lesson that they would never get in Primary School and a peak at life in a secondary school. It's ostensibly provided for our Year 5 children in order to try and drum up support for the school and all the secondary schools carry out some form advertising like this for the Year 5's but, actually, we like it because it begins to prepare the children for what lies ahead for them in secondary school. As HHS is right on our doorstep, we do get extra-special treatment for which I'm very grateful.
- Tuesday was a very exciting day. We began in the morning, at 7:30 am, signing in to the DfE standards board waiting in a queue for 20 minutes for our Year 6 SATs results. That little blue circle just revolved and revolved until, finally, a message flashed up saying that the site was closed for 'planned maintenance'!! You can imagine our frustration! Finally, though, the results were through and we could see how our Year 6 children had faired. And, my goodness, they smashed it! Here are our school results compared to National results Well done Year 6 and all the staff and parents that have supported these children on their academic journey so far:

SUBJECT	Our Year 6	National
Reading	91%	74%
Maths	77%	73%
Writing	75%	72%
Grammar & Spelling	77%	72%
Science	93%	81%
Combined (Passing all 3 subjects)	65%	61%

These % show how many children passed each subject.

- Tuesday was also the day when each class discovered who their new teacher would be next year. This is always an exciting moment. We all meet in the dining hall and each class stands up in turn as I reveal their new teacher and then a cheer usually erupts, the new teacher takes a bow and they all walk out to spend an hour getting to know one another. It's lovely when there are big changes like this year with Ms Goodwin moving out of EYFS for the first time in about 20 years and Ms Howard moving to Year 6 for the first time because the children are shocked and you hear all the gasps as the announcements are made. It's one of the really lovely moments of the school year. Almost all the children were happy with a very few exceptions (because they were hoping for a particular teacher that they didn't get) but most were ecstatic, some even crying with happiness!
- After school, on Tuesday, was our Open Evening the time when the year's work is displayed for you to come and look at in every class in every year group and you turned up in your droves this year! I was so pleased because the children had worked really hard on their projects and the staff had worked really hard putting it

- all on display. There were many moments of note but I was mostly moved by the obvious pride with which your children were showing you their work. I saw little hands dragging big arms over to this wall and that table excitedly pointing at the work they had on display! Moments like that are priceless and they are the snapshots in my memory album that I will never forget. Thank you for visiting and showing your children the value of school! Not only that, but teachers were so grateful to receive your votes of thanks for the year coming to a close and your votes of confidence for the year about to begin. Those words mean a lot to them.
- Pre-loved uniform was being sold for a donation in the Infant Library on Open Evening and I was really glad to see so many parents buying it making good use of perfectly good uniform which will only have to be thrown away if it's not recycled.
- Wednesday was another jam-packed day as many of our staff took part in First-Aid
 Training so they are now fully functioning First-Aiders it's a whole day's training
 which can be quite draining when you're concentrating so hard for that length of time!
- And there was a palpable buzz around the Year 6 classes on Wednesday with whispers in corners and giggles on benches; it could only mean *one* thing the Year 6 Leavers' Party was afoot! And what a magnificent shindig it turned out to be with 'Magic Mirrors', 'Nosecco drinks' and 'Balloon Arches' adorning the venue. Children dressed up in their finery, were papped like stars and danced till dawn (slight exaggeration alert but you get my drift!). Year 6 parents did a grand job and everyone had a wonderful time!
- Thursday was 'Report Day'!! The day of results for many; the day of reckoning for some!! I hope you were all happy with the rounding up of your child's achievement and progress from over the year and that the report supports what you know your child to be.
- Finally Friday was Sports Day it's been such an unsettled week weather-wise that we changed our minds on a daily basis about cancelling it or running it. Luckily, the weather held out and we were able to hold the annual event without too much slipping and sliding! It was just a bit windy at times. The winning Team from Sports Day and the medals will be announced next week along with our Best Attenders and our overall House winners in a special assembly. Thank you to Mr Charlee who organised the day.
- And that brings us to the end of this week's newsletter. It's been an eventful week, that's for sure! It just remains for me to wish you a warm and sunny weekend (and, hopefully, a winning Sunday evening!!) and, in light of all things sporting, of treating triumph and disaster just the same when meeting them, I leave you with this


