Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope I'm not too premature with my summer welcome this week but I'm hoping if I welcome it in, it'll be here for good! Not many weeks left for us to actually benefit from summery weather! Here are this week's highlights:



- This is the second week that our After School Club (Harrow Lodge Hangout) has been running and it seems to be going well. Food is great, activities are superb and children are having a ball!


